Grandezza e allualità di Giovanni Serga

Giovanni Verga is, along with Manzoni, the greatest Italian author of the nineteenth century and one of the most important writers of European Naturalism. Through his masterpieces, (the novels, *I Malavoglia* and *Mastro-don Gesualdo*, as well as the stories, *Vita di campi* and *Novelle rusticane*) he managed to give us an extraordinary literary representation of his homeland, Sicily. He composed an original linguistic and anthropological "translation" through which he shared the reality of his homeland with readers throughout Italy. Moreover, his works and characters are not limited to testifying their era and specific social condition. Instead, if we were to interrogate his heroes, we would discover that they "speak" to us and can enter "our lives".

Andrea Manganaro holds the rank of Associate Professor in the Department of Humanities at the University of Catania where he teaches Italian literature and History and Criticism of Italian literature. His publications and research interests cover several aspects of Italian Literature. The main focus of his research is the relation between forms, genre and meaning in literature, with an emphasis on the Italian short stories, the poetic of the 16th century, critics and historiography of the Italian literature between the 19th and 20th centuries, Ugo Foscolo, Giovanni Verga, Benedetto Croce. He participates regularly in national and international Conferences. He has also delivered numerous invited presentations at international conferences including keynote and plenary talks.
