(MORE) I like playing tennis ----more than-----playing squash.

(FROM) It isn’t to the station.

2. Only five people came to Sarah’s party.
(PEOPLE) Only a to Sarah’s party.

3. Jacob got the highest mark in the maths exam.
(MARK) Nobody got a Jacob in the maths exam.

4. We haven’t got any milk left. Could you buy some more?
(OUT) We have milk. Could you buy some more?

5. “Can I borrow some money?” Martin asked his sister.
(TO) Martin asked his sister some money.

6. We’ll miss the bus if you don’t hurry up!

(UNLESS) We'll miss the bus up!

7. These jeans don't fit me any more!

(SMALL) These jeans for me now.

8. The Robinson family bought our house.

(BY) Our house the Robinson family.

9. My advice to you is to study more.

(START) I think you more.

10. "Stop making so much noise!" Mum told the children.

(MAKE) Mum told the children so much noise.
