Third NeuroHumanities Dialogue **Ars et Ingenium: The Processes of Imagination**

26 - 28 May 2016 CATANIA - Italy

Following the first NeuroHumanities Dialogue focused on "Neuroaesthetics and Cognitive Poetics" (2014) and the second on "Metaphors as source of creative thought" (2015), the NewHums Research Centre of the University of Catania is pleased to announce the Third Dialogue between neuroscientists and humanists.

The event will take place at the Aula Magna of the Main Building of the University (Palazzo del Rettorato) and at the Benedictine Monastery in Catania.

The topic of the 2016 Dialogue is: Ars et Ingenium: The Processes of Imagination

Deborah Jenson, Professor of Romance Studies at the Duke University and Director of Duke's Franklin Humanities Institute

Gabrielle Starr, Professor of English and Dean of the College of Arts and Science at the New York University

Mark Turner, Professor of Cognitive Science at Case Western Reserve University **Semir Zeki**, Professor of Neurobiology at the University College London

The peculiarity of the meeting relies on its format: a real dialogue between scientists and human scholars with plenty of time for discussion and a final roundtable with respondents.

Main focus of this year Dialogue is the investigation of the imagination. This topic has been philosophically and scientifically studied with different, contradictory and partial results. It has also been meta-critically reflected upon in art and poetry. Art can be considered as a creative human process of experiencing, understanding and communicating reality through images, symbols and metaphors, i. e. through Imagination. Art and literature often become a favoured way to reflect meta-critically upon the "imaginative processes" of imagination as a complex multimodal and emergent phenomenon implying cognitive and emotional activations.







Relevant questions of the recent discussion about imagination will be focus of the Third NeuroHumanities Dialogue in Catania, such as: why is imagination such an important factor in human experience? Why is human thinking based on imaginative processes, even if it is not so apparently? Why is art in general, and literature in particular, generated through imagination and generates imagination? And last, but not least, how can imagination be measured and improved?
